An Analysis of Taiwanese Contemporary Creations of Lighting and a Design Project therefrom


Abstract

Nowadays people in Taiwan have upgraded their living standards and emphasized more on the aesthetics of lighting products and would like to pay more on them. Motivated by this trend, the current research is aimed to explore the expression skills encoded within Taiwanese contemporary lighting creations. The subjects we have surveyed include artifacts from craft design, product design, and space and environment design. We attempt to draw basic principles particularly useful to product designers. The research process consists of literature review, product analysis, and interviewing. We have interviewed 28 designers and studied more than 100 products of theirs. The qualitative data is then analyzed for correlation study and differentiation comparison. By integration and induction, the context of art and design for the contemporary lighting creations is thus reconstructed. We emphasize on producing a design knowledge of expression skills and selection of materials and technologies. We then design three lighting products based on what we have learned in
